IV. Purpose of data processing

The purpose of the data processing is to conduct a survey to obtain a basic overview of research data management practices at the University of Freiburg, to identify acute needs for research data management support, and to perceive service requests.

V. Legal basis for processing

Article 6 paragraph 1 subparagraph 1 letter a GDPR (consent).

VI. Duration of data storage

The individual questionnaires will be deleted no later than six months after the survey has been conducted. The survey results will be published anonymously.

VII. External Recipients

The University of Freiburg uses the data processor enuvo GmbH, Huobstrasse 10, 8808 Pfäffikon SZ, Switzerland (Umfrageonline.com) to carry out the survey.

VIII. Rights of Data Subjects

- You have the right to obtain information from the University of Freiburg about the data processed concerning you (Art. 15 GDPR).
- You have the right to have incorrectly stored data corrected or completed (Art. 16 GDPR).
- Under certain conditions, you have the right to have your data deleted (Art. 17 GDPR).
- Under certain conditions, you have the right to restrict processing (Art. 18 GDPR).
- Under certain conditions, you have the right to data portability (Art. 20 GDPR).
- Furthermore, if you have given us your consent to process your data, you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time, without affecting the lawfulness of the processing carried out on the basis of the consent until its withdrawal.
- Finally, you have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority if you believe that the processing of your personal data violates data protection regulations. One such supervisory authority is, for example, the State Commissioner for Data Protection and Freedom of Information of Baden-Württemberg (<https://www.baden-wuerttemberg.datenschutz.de>).
